For entries made with American Express, Discover, MasterCard, or Visa: A \$3.50 charge will be added to each entry for use of this service. Those received by phone or fax will not be accepted. Changes, additions, or corrections to the entry form must be received in writing prior to the close of entries. Those received by phone will not be accepted. An administrative fee of \$2.00 will be charged for all cancellations or changes made prior to the closing of entries. Refunds of \$3.50 or less will not be issued due to the processing costs. All refunds will not be mailed out until after the show. Returned checks or declined credit or debit cards do not count as a valid entry fee. Fees must be paid in guaranteed funds. Checks will not be accepted for check that did not clear. The Show Secretary will add a \$32.00 fee to the amount of the check for completing the transaction and reprocessing entries.

Chapter 11, Section 1. No dog shall be exhibited in a licensed or member dog show, except for dogs entered in the Miscellaneous Class unless it is either individually registered in the AKC Stud Book or individually registered with a foreign registry organization whose pedigrees are acceptable for AKC registration. For complete details see Rules Applying to Dog Shows, Chapter 11, Section 1. Effective January 1, 2026 Chapter 11, Section 2 The American Kennel Club will collect a \$4.00 Event Service Fee for the first entry of a dog and a \$4.50 service fee for each additional entry of the same dog in the regular and non-regular recordable single-entry classes, in all AKC licensed and member club events. (There is no recording fee or event service fee for sweepstakes, futurities, brace/team, multi-dog classes, or special attractions.) The current 50 cent recording will continue to be collected. The event-giving club shall assume the responsibility of collecting all Event Service Fees for the American Kennel Club. That fact shall be stated in the premium list. These event

service and recording fees shall be forwarded to the American Kennel Club along with all other required event results within seven (7) days of the close of the event.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS: Entries will be acknowledged after the entries have closed. Entry acknowledgment and judging program to be sent to the email address on entry. Should an exhibitor NOT receive the entry acknowledgment within a reasonable time, please notify the Show Secretary at the address provided. PSSSS will not accept any entry that includes or specifies any conditions. Telephone, telegraph, fax, and unsigned entries cannot be accepted and will get returned. Entries not on Official AKC Entry Forms and photocopies of Entry Forms without the Agreement and Rules on the reverse side are NOT ACCEPTABLE. The Club and or Show Secretary assumes no responsibility for wrong or incomplete information given on the entry blank by the dog owner or agent who entered a dog in a class that the dog is not eligible to compete in.

THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE COMPLETENESS OF ANY ENTRY RESTS SOLELY WITH THE ENTRANT.

PSSSS will not refund any Entry fees if a dog is absent, disqualified, sick, lame, excused by the Judge or Veterinarian, barred from competition by action of the Show Committee, or because it was entered incorrectly. There is no refund of the entry fee for bitches in season, except for bitches entered in Junior Showmanship, Obedience, or Rally. There is no refund for DUPLICATE ENTRIES OR, because of riots, civil disturbances, or other acts beyond the control of the management, if it is impossible to hold the show. No dogs will be allowed in the show area except those entered. The judging will start promptly. Dogs may arrive anytime before their time of judging and may leave immediately afterward unless required for further judging. Exhibitors are responsible for having their dog ready to be shown and at the entrance of the judging ring when the steward calls for the class.

FOR LOSS AND OR DAMAGES: The Show Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors. The Show Committee and Event Secretary will not be responsible for or assume any liability in the case of any injury or misfortune to either dogs or exhibitors participating in this event. The responsibility and welfare of an exhibitor's child are assumed to be the exhibitor's responsibility. All exhibitors will exercise control and restraint over their children on the day of the show. The Club has the right to substitute a prize for equal or more value. Trophies must be claimed on the day of the show. No prizes will be mailed or otherwise distributed.

SWEEPSTAKES CASH PRIZES are awarded to the handler showing the dog while in the ring. Prize Money Claims for the prize money must be made while in the ring and before the breed judging is over. The Show Secretary and The Club disclaim any liability for cash prize after the Breed judging is over.

All PERSONS ATTENDING THIS DOG SHOW waive any claim for damages against THE CLUB, its members, or agents in the event that a motor vehicle must be entered to rescue a dog from overheating or suffocation due to improper ventilation. The CLUB, its show secretaries, their agents, employees, etc, will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors but will assume no responsibility for any loss, damage, or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or to any of their dogs or property participating in these shows, and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children at these shows. Any exhibitor or person they employ found to be littering or failing to clean up after their dogs will be brought before the Event Committee. The CLUB does not agree to arbitrate claims as set forth on the official American Kennel Club entry form for this event. No dog shall be left unattended in any closed vehicle.

POINTS FOR RESERVE

Chapter 16 Section 1 Rules Applying to Dog Shows ... the dog designated Reserve Winners Dog and the bitch designated Reserve Winners Bitch will be awarded a three-point major, provided that the number of dogs competing in the regular classes of the Reserve Winner's sex totals at least twice the number required for a five point major, in the region in which the event is held.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES (INVOLVING SINGLE DOG ENTRIES)

Veteran Class (7 yrs & under 10 yrs Old)

Veteran Class (10 yrs & Older)

The winners of veteran classes will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed. Any veterans defeated in these classes may not compete for Best of Breed, even if entered in the class. Chapter 11, Section 8 of the "Rules Applying to Dog Shows" Neutered dogs and spayed bitches would be allowed to compete in Veterans and all other single entry non-regular classes only at independent specialties and/or those all-breed shows which do not offer any competitive classes beyond Best of Breed. Winners of the Veteran Classes will compete for Best of Breed (Variety), if undefeated.

BEST OF BREED COMPETITION

Best of Breed Competition: The following categories of dogs may be entered and shown in Best of Breed/Variety Competition: Dogs that are Champions of Record and dogs which according to their owner's records, have completed the requirements for a championship, but whose championships are unconfirmed. The showing of unconfirmed Champions in Best of Breed/ Variety Competition is limited to a period of 90 days from the date of the show where the dog completed the requirements for a championship.

Award of Merit for Superior Quality - At the discretion of the judge, up to TWO Awards of Merit from dogs/bitches in Best of Breed may be awarded.

Best Bred-By-Exhibitor and BBE Eligibility - All dogs entered in the Bred-By Class must be individually registered with AKC. The person handling the dog must be a breeder of record of the dog and an owner of record of the dog. Family members must be both a breeder and owner of record to exhibit in the class. Any entry in the Bred-By-Exhibitor classes that is awarded Best of Breed or Best of Winners would automatically be Best Bred-By-Exhibitor. Only the dog or bitch not defeated in Bred-By-Exhibitor Class are eligible for the Best Bred-By-Exhibitor competition. Best Bred-By-Exhibitor will be selected from the winners of the Bred-By-Exhibitor Puppy Classes (6-12 mos.) and the Bred-By-Exhibitor Adult Classes (12 mos. and over) at the conclusion of Best of Competition.

Best Puppy from the regular classes - Any entry in the puppy classes that is awarded Best of Breed or Best of Winners would automatically be Best Puppy. Only dogs not defeated in a puppy class are eligible for Best Puppy Competition.

Best in Veteran Class - Any entry in the Veteran Class that is awarded Best of Breed would automatically be Best in Veteran Class. Only dogs not defeated in Veteran Class are eligible for Best In Veteran Competition

Best Veteran from the Non-Veteran Competition. Any entry in the Veteran class that is awarded Best of Breed would automatically be Best in Veteran Class. Only dogs not defeated in Veteran class are eligible for Best in Veteran Class.

Non-Regular Classes (Involving Multiple dog entries)

As the judge's decision in the Non-Regular Classes involving Multiple Dog Entries is based on the merits of more than one dog or bitch, not one of the dogs or bitches making up the entry judged first in these classes will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won these classes.

Stud Dog Class – For Stud Dogs at least two and no more than four of their Get. It is not necessary that the Get be under the same ownership as that of the Stud Dog. The Stud Dog may be entered separately in one of the regular classes, or if a Champion of Record in Best of Breed Competition, but **MUST** be entered in the Stud Dog Class, the Get **MUST** be entered in one of the regular classes. The Stud Dog shall be considered as one entry and requires one regular Class entry fee, this being the regular fee plus the additional class fee if the Stud Dog is entered in another class. The Stud Dog must be shown in the ring with the Get. The class will be judged on the merits of the Get.

Brood Bitch Class – Same as for the Stud Dog except substitute Brood Bitch for Stud Dog and Produce for Get.

PARADE OF TITLEHOLDERS

Show off your wonderful English Cockers and all the titles your special dog/bitch has earned over the years!!

To enter: Complete the regular AKC dog show application. The entry fee is \$25 and in the event area - write Parade of Titleholders. Send the entry to Pat Shaw, the show secretary.

In addition to the AKC form, please bring a document with the script for what you want read during your special time in the ring. This should include performance, conformation, hunting, tracking, and any other special titles your dog holds. The script should be 250 words or less. You will circle the ring, then remain in the ring until the script is complete and you have received your rosette.

This is a wonderful event to allow owners with all sorts of interests to show off their dogs and hear their accomplishments read and appreciated by the onlookers.

SANCTIONED FOUR-TO-SIX MONTH BEGINNER PUPPY ENGLISH COCKER SPANIEL ONLY



This is an abbreviated version of the AKC Regulations (regarding the 4-6 Month Puppy competition.) Please refer to the regulation for a full description of this class. One combined class will be offered for dogs that are four months and under six months as described in Chapter 3, Section 1 of the Rules Applying to Dog Shows. There will be a selection of Best of Breed Puppy.

Dogs must be four months of age and under six months. Dogs are required to be vaccinated in accordance with their veterinarian's protocol in order to avoid inadvertent transmission of illness by/to puppies not yet fully immunized. AKC Rules in Dealing with Misconduct will be applicable to any person and dog entered at this competition. All applicable rules found in Rules applying to Dog Shows will govern the conduct of this competition unless these regulations state otherwise. AKC registration number or an AKC litter number will be required for entries of an AKC recognized breed as listed in Chapter 3, Section 1 of the Rules Applying to Dog Shows. Exhibitors should plan on opening the mouth of their puppy for the judges. Classes will not be divided by sex in this competition. Breed standard disqualifications such as color, height, weight or dentition shall not be a point of consideration in the judging process for this 4-6 month Puppy Special Attraction event.

Professional Handlers are not permitted to exhibit in this class. Dogs that are owned or co-owned by a professional handler may compete in this class but must be handled by a non-professional handler. Professional handlers are defined as any person who belongs or has belonged to a professional handlers' organization, distributed rate cards, or otherwise advertised or represented themselves as handling dogs for pay within the last five years. Dogs may not be exhibited by current assistants or household members of a professional handle

Sweepstakes is open to all registered dogs that are 6 months of age & under 18 months of age on the day of the show. Dogs shown in sweepstakes must also be entered in one of the regular classes at the regular entry fee and on the regular entry form. Sweepstakes will be judged prior to regular classes. Indicate your Sweepstakes Class with the age division in the space provided for "Additional class". Entry fee is \$30.

The following classes will be provided for both dogs and bitches:

- Puppy 6 mos. & under 9 mos.
- Puppy 9 mos. & under 12 mos.
- Junior 12 mos. & under 15 mos.
- Junior, 15 mos. & under 18 mos.

VETERAN SWEEPSTAKES

Requirements & Classification

Veteran Sweepstakes is open to all registered dogs that are 7 years of age or older on the day of the show. Neutered dogs and spayed bitches may be entered in Veteran Sweepstakes. Entrants may or may not be finished champions. Dogs shown in Veteran Sweepstakes need not be entered in one of the regular classes or at the regular entry fee. Veteran Sweepstakes will be judged prior to regular classes. Indicate your Veteran Sweepstakes Class with the age division in the space provided for "Additional class". Entry fee is \$30.

The following classes will be provided for both dogs and bitches

- Veterans, 7 yrs & Under 10 yrs
- Veterans 10 yrs & Older

PRIZE MONEY FOR SWEEPSTAKES & VETERAN SWEEPSTAKES

After 25% is deducted to defray expenses, the remaining monies will be divided as follows: 50% will be divided between Best in Sweepstakes/Veteran Sweepstakes 2/3 and Best of Opposite to Best in Sweepstakes/Veteran Sweepstakes 1/3. The remaining 50% will be divided among placements of each class depending on the number of entries in each class.

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP COMPETITION

English Cocker Spaniel Only

Novice Class – For boys and girls at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show who at the time entries close, have not won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class. A first place in a Novice Class without competition leading to a Best Junior with competition would count as one win towards moving to Open at a licensed or member show.

Open Class - For boys and girls at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show who at the time entries close, have won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class or if a win in Novice leads to a Best Junior with competition present it will count as one win toward moving to Open in a licensed or member show.

Master Junior Class - This class will be for boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years on the day of the show, and who have won the 10 first place wins in an Open class with competition to be eligible to enter the Limited Class Competition. The calendar for this class will be consistent with the eligibility date for the AKC National Championship. All Juniors meeting the criteria for this class are required to enter the Master Class and must change their entry the day of the show if entries have already closed. Once the eligibility time frame for that year has passed all participants return to the Open Class to compete for the following year.

NOTICE: JUNIOR HANDLERS MUST INCLUDE THEIR AKC JUNIOR HANDLER NUMBER ON EACH ENTRY. You may obtain your junior identification number by calling the AKC, Judges Education Department. (919) 233-9767. Be sure all information for Junior Showmanship classes is entered on front and back of entry form.

Children between 5 years to under 9 years can join the fun of dog showing. This class is being offered to inspire young handlers to love and show their dogs. This event is for exhibition only and there will be no placement of the entries. All children will receive the same participation award from the judge. Dogs are to be AKC recognized English Cocker Spaniels and at least 4 months old. Children enter the ring with their dog one at a time. For more information, contact The Club. Prior to the beginning of the class, the responsible adult will sign a RELEASE OF LIABILITY FORM. Each child will receive a Rosette and participation gift. Bitches in season will not be allowed to participate. A dog may be substituted that meets the eligibility requirements as specified by the Club. All dogs entered must have the proper lead and collar. A responsible adult must be present with the child both inside and outside the ring. The adult is to maintain control of the dog outside of the ring. A release must be signed by the child's parent or legal guardian. This release will be available onsite and must be signed before going into the ring. The safety of both the dogs and juniors inside and outside the ring is a primary concern. Outside of the ring, the dog is to be controlled by the adult accompanying the child. An additional lead, provided by The Club, will be at the Judge's table. At the judge's discretion based upon the size of the child and the dog, for safety purposes the adult may be asked to attach a second lead to the dog so both child and adult will walk the dog together.

Recognizing that periodically reaffirming our shared values strengthens our community, the revised code will be shared widely to highlight the foundational values and principles that define the sport.

- Sportspeople always place the welfare of their dog above all else.
- Sportspeople prioritize the long-term health and preservation of their breed, making decisions that reflect a deep commitment to responsible breeding and ownership.
- Sportspeople respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportspeople conduct themselves in a manner that reflects positively on the sport, the American Kennel Club, and themselves.
- Sportspeople appreciate, encourage and support all who associate with and participate in the sports by fostering an environment where respect, equity, inclusion, and courtesy are foundational.
- Sportspeople understand, uphold and abide by all AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies.
- Sportspeople contribute to a positive atmosphere at events by avoiding negative gossip, disparagement, or unsportsmanlike behavior.
- Sportspeople extend their values of civility, fairness, and respect to all digital and social media platforms.
- Sportspeople actively support the education and mentorship of newcomers, helping them learn the rules, values, and traditions of the sport in a respectful way.
- Sportspeople recognize that they are role models in the sport, and strive to lead by example through humility, kindness, and ethical conduct.
- Sportspeople treat fellow exhibitors, judges, officials, volunteers, spectators, and AKC staff with dignity and respect, regardless of experience, background, or differences in opinion.
- Sportspeople are committed to fair play, honesty, courtesy, and competition, approaching both winning and losing with grace.
- Sportspeople understand that strong competition and civility can—and should—coexist. They appreciate the quality of their competitors, and the effort put forth by others.
- Sportspeople uphold their responsibilities to the sport of purebred dogs and refuse to let personal gain or self-interest influence their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsperson judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsperson judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsperson exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsperson exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- Sportspeople are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportspeople decline to exploit any positions of authority or recognition for personal advantage.
- Sportspeople appreciate those that have gone before them and realize they are responsible for maintaining and enhancing the sport for future generations.
