Changes, additions, or corrections to the entry form must be received in writing prior to the close of entries. Those received by phone will not be acceptable. An administrative fee of \$2.00 will be charged for all cancellations or changes made prior to the closing of entries. Refunds of \$3.50 or less will not be issued due to the processing costs. All refunds will not be mailed out until after the show.

Returned checks or declined credit or debit cards do not count as a valid entry fee. Fees must be paid in guaranteed funds. Checks will not be accepted. The Show Secretary will add a \$32.00 fee to the amount of the check for completing the transaction and reprocessing entries.

NATIONAL OWNER-HANDLED SERIES

The AKC National Owner-Handled Series is a celebration of the dedication and enthusiasm of owner-handlers and is open to purebred dogs that are at least six months of age. Exhibitors must declare their dog is Owner-Handled eligible at the time of entry on the entry form. Dogs entered in the Amateur-Owner-Handler class will automatically be marked as eligible to compete in the NOHS. Eligible dogs will be identified by an

asterisk in the judge's book, steward's book & the catalog. Dogs must be handled throughout the breed level competition for the regular show by an eligible owner. Professional handlers*, household members and current assistants** to professional handlers may not exhibit the dog in any NOHS competition during the entire show. For a detailed description of the National Owner-Handled Series.

*Professional handlers are defined as any person who belongs or has belonged to a professional handlers' organization, distributed rate cards, or otherwise advertised or represented themselves as handling dogs for pay within the last five years. **A current assistant is defined as anyone employed by a professional handler on a full-time basis or assisting a professional handler at the show or any time during the cluster/weekend. Current assistants that are eligible to compete in Junior Showmanship (meet age & amateur status requirements) may participate in NOHS.

AKC SANCTIONED 4 & UNDER 6 MONTHS PUPPY COMPETITION

One combined class will be offered for breeds and varieties of dogs that are four months and under six months and divided into Groups as described in Chapter 3, Section 1 of the Rules Applying to Dog Shows and the Miscellaneous Class breeds as listed in

Chapter 3, Section 23. There will be a selection of Best of Breed Puppy in each Breed/Variety. All Best of Breed Puppy winners will then compete in their respective group for First through Fourth. For more information and eligibility requirements please visit Beginner Puppy Regulations.

**Please Note - We will do our best to avoid scheduling conflicts between the 4-6 month Classes and the Regular Classes, however, if conflicts occur NO refund will be given.

Non-Regular Classes Involving Single Dog Entries

The following non-regular classes will be provided for both dogs and bitches. Winners are eligible, if otherwise undefeated, to compete in Best of Breed Competition. Veteran Classes - Class for dogs & class for bitches 7 years old or older. Entries in the Veteran classes may be spayed or neutered.

VETERAN CLASSES

Dogs, 7 years and under 9 years	Bitches, 7 years and under 9 years
Dogs, 9 years and over	Bitches, 9 years and over

FIELD TRIAL CLASSES

Class for dogs & class for bitches that have placed in a Regular Derby, Gun dog, or an All Age Stake at a licensed AKC Field Trial. Exhibitor must Attach Verification to the entry form (trial name, date, class and placement). Puppy stakes do not count. Neutered Dogs and Spayed Bitches are eligible to compete.

HUNTER

Versatility/Hunter Certificate Class - Class for dogs & class for bitches that have attained his/her Versatility Certificate, Versatility Advanced, Versatility Excellent, Junior Hunter, Senior Hunter, Master Hunter. Neutered Dogs and Spayed Bitches are eligible to compete. (Photo copy of Certificate must be attached to entry).

BEST OF BREED COMPETITION

Non-Regular Classes Involving Multiple Dog Entries

Note: Non-regular classes involving multiple entries may be judged before or after Best of Breed. As the judge's decision in these classes will be based on the merits of more than one dog, no one of the dogs making up the entry judged first in the class will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed by virtue of having won the class.

Stud Dog Class and Brood Bitch Class: Each entry is shown with not less than two nor more than four of their get. The merits of the Stud Dog or Brood Bitch are not considered in the placement of the entry. It is the quality of the get that forms the basis for the judge's decision. All get must be examined and gaited. The Stud Dog or Brood Bitch must also be examined to determine if there is a condition that would require disqualification or excusable under the Rules, AKC policy or the breed standard. All get must be entered in a regular class in order to be eligible to compete in the Stud Dog or Brood Bitch Class. Handlers of the Stud Dog or Brood Bitch, and all get being exhibited, must wear armbands. Ch. 11, Sec. 8 of the "Rules Applying to Dog Shows" provides that "a castrated male may be entered as a Stud Dog in the Stud Dog Class and a spayed bitch may be entered as a Brood Bitch in the Brood Bitch Class."

Brace Class: Two Dogs, performing in unison, and presented by a maximum of two handlers. Both dogs competing in the brace class must have at least one common owner. Dogs do not need to be entered in any other class. Dogs comprising a Brace Class must be named at the time of entry, and full particulars must be given for each dog on individual entry forms. If a dog which is to be part of a Brace is not entered in another class, it must be entered for "Brace Class only." An entry form for a dog entered in another class and entered as part of a Brace must be marked accordingly in the space provided for additional classes as "Brace Class."

Team Class: Four Dogs, performing in unison, and presented by a maximum of four handlers. Dogs competing in the team class must have at least one common owner. Dogs do not need to be entered in any other class. Dogs comprising a Team Class must be named at the time of entry, and full particulars must be given for each dog on individual entry forms. If a dog which is to be part of a Team is not entered in another class, it must be entered for "Team Class only." An entry form for a dog entered in another class and entered as part of a Team must be marked accordingly in the space provided for additional classes as "Team Class."

MAILED ENTRIES FOR BRACE AND TEAM MUST CONTAIN A LIST OF ALL TEAM MEMBERS WITH THEIR REGISTRATION NUMBERS. If entering online, you MUST send an email to secretary@patriciashawsss.com with a list of all brace/team members with their registration numbers, OR ENTRY MAY BE REFUSED.

Best Puppy Competition - For winners of the Puppy Dog and Puppy Bitch 6-9 months and 9-12 months and Bred-by-Exhibitor Puppy classes unless defeated by another puppy for Winners or Best of Winners.

POINTS FOR RESERVE WINNERS DOG & BITCH

CH. 16: SEC. 1 (new 6th paragraph) Each AKC Parent Specialty Club shall have one designated Parent Club National Specialty show per year. All others shall be termed a Parent Club Specialty Show. Unless the Parent Club, in its Application to the AKC to hold its National Specialty, chooses to exclude the following Award; At the National Specialty the dog designated Reserve Winners Dog and the Bitch designated Reserve Winners will be awarded a three (3) point major, provided that the number of dogs competing in the regular classes of the Reserve Winners sex totals at least twice the number required for a five (5) point major, in the region in which this event is held. No Major for Reserve Winners shall be given based upon an award of Best of Winners. In counting the number of dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, or that is dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge or from which all awards are withheld, shall not be included.

JUDGE'S AWARD OF MERIT

At the conclusion of Best of Breed judging, after picking Best of Breed, Best of Winners, Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed, Select Dog and Select Bitch, the judge at his discretion may choose up to 10% of the Best of Breed entry for an Award of Merit. The award shall be a medal on a ribbon to be worn around the neck of each dog selected. Winners Dog and Winners Bitch are not eligible for Awards of Merit.

PARADE OF TITLE HOLDERS

All Irish Setters who have earned a title, both American and foreign, are eligible for the Parade, for which a fee of \$25.00 will be charged. Entry form must state "PARADE OF TITLE HOLDERS". Entries must be mailed to Sandy Jones as directed on entry form. Rosettes with dog's name inscribed will be offered to all participants in the Parade. Rosettes must be claimed the day of the show. Rosettes will not be mailed. SEE ENTRY FORM ON PAGE 21.

SWEEPSTAKES
JUDGE: Patty Fanelli

The Sweepstakes is open to all Irish Setters who, on the opening day of the show, will be six months and under eighteen months of age. Entry fee is \$22.00 to be paid in addition to the Regular Class entry fee. All entries in the Sweepstakes MUST also be entered in a Regular Breed Class. The Sweepstakes class should be shown as an Additional Class on the same entry form used to enter the dog or bitch in a Regular Class.

These event service and recording fees shall be forwarded to the American Kennel Club along with all other required event results within seven (7) days of the close of the event.

ENTRY FEES shall not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of Show Committee. If because of riots, civil disturbances or other acts beyond the control of the management it is impossible to open or to complete the show, no refund of entry fee will be made.
